

# Take part in our Super Safety competition

Every day a child is very seriously hurt by an accident. Lots can be done to stop serious accidents happening. Can you think of what might cause an accident at home, in the garden, out playing?

We want you to design a eye-catching and colourful poster to help children to stay safe from accidents.

Here are some clues about the kinds of serious accidents children have

**At home** - getting burned on a hot drink or kettle. Not sitting still to eat and choking on food. Finding tablets in Gran's handbag on the floor and swallowing them.

**In the garden** – eating berries or plants that are poisonous. Young children falling in the pond or paddling pool.

**Out and about** – crossing the road without looking and getting run down. Not wearing a cycle helmet on your bike. Not holding an adult's hand.

You might want to make your poster about how you would avoid one of the things above or think of something else yourself. Remember to think about what your poster's safety message is and make it clear in your poster.

There are four age groups for this competition:

**Age 3-4 / Age 5-7 / Age 8-11 / Age 12-14**

We will choose a winner from each age group. Each winner will receive a **£20 voucher** to spend on **CDs, DVDs, books or stationery or craft materials.**
